EDUCATION MINISTRY

The education ministry witnessed a lot of co-curricular activities - cultural activities, sports, art and craft both at the school level and inter-school level, during these months.

All the schools celebrated the *Independence day* of our country on 15th of August, commemorating that historical event of the dawn of 15th August, 1947, when India was freed from the clutches of the British colonizers and began to traverse the path of development. Cultural events were held to highlight the sacrifices of our freedom fighters, and all those who continue to contribute to the nation building.

Another event celebrated in all our schools is the *Teachers' Day* on 5th September, where the students honored their teachers with many activities - prayer service, cultural program, gifts, and words of

appreciation and so on. It's a day that the teachers and the students alike look forward to every year.

Seminar for teachers : SJC organized a seminar for the teachers of SJC Bankipore, SJC - Bihar Board, Jethuli and Mary Ward Kindergarten on 24th August, 2024. The resource person for this seminar was Fr. Suresh Mathew, the former editor of current magazine. enriched the teachers with his He valuable viewpoints and his approach towards life and learning. He filled in a new spark of enhancing our teaching



techniques from student's view point. The seminar was highly interactive and touched a new chord of our perception. Around 220 teachers participated in the seminar.

We now take you through some of the events particular to each school.

We start with the tiny tots of St. Mary's Pre-Primary School, Namchi, who had various activities on a daily basis for three weeks, as per the instructions by the Sikkim government according to the New Education Policy. Sr. Shobhana was very busy uploading daily activities with photos on the Government website. The month of July ended with ''Priti Bhoj (a meal)'' which was prepared by the parents of our students for the parents and staffs in school itself. There was one week program of Sweksha Pakawara in the school.





By no way the tiny tots of Mary Ward Kindergarten, Bankipore, were to sit back and relax; this is a year when the Jubilee bells are ringing in their school, of the 25 silver years of the institutions' thriving existence. The entire campus celebrated the opening ceremony on 6th July, with cultural activities; Most Rev. Sebastian Kallupura, the Archbishop of Patna was the Chief Guest. The ceremony concluded with the planting of sapling in our JPIC garden by the Chief Guest, sisters, teachers and children. The campus now awaits a new

statue of Venerable Mary Ward before the closing of the Jubilee year in December this year.

St. Mary's School, Singla, promoting the integrity of creation, organized a fancy dress competition with dresses made out of thrown away materials that captured the fancy of the audience.

SJC – BSEB conducted fancy dress competition for classes LKG to III, with the 'FREEDOM' FIGHTERS OF INDIA & ENVIROMENT' children came out with their hidden talents and beautiful presentation giving the values and





importance of environment.

On 2nd and 3rd of September our students went to Patliputra sports club for basketball tournaments and four of our students are selected for the district level. Hindi Day celebration was another special event of the season.

SJC - ICSE – The parents' meeting held for the class X stressed upon the importance of strengthening discipline and good behavior among the students. Emphasis was laid upon the usage of Campus Care App and the parents were asked to check their ward's attendance regularly. Sr. Josephine, the Principal enlightened the parents regarding the draw backs of non-attending classes that is catching up since many students complete Higher Secondary studies along with coaching for Common Entrance exams.

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Orientation for students: Rotary Patna Midtown held an interactive awareness session on sex education and menstrual hygiene at SJC on 13th September. The speakers included Dr. Amrita Rakesh, a consultant oncologist at Savera Cancer hospital, Patna and Dr. Apoorva Nidhi, a resident at the same hospital. They busted the myths and taboos associated with these concepts with the help of medical knowledge and scientific facts.

SJC hosted the ASISC inter-school debate competition on 4th May, 2024 with the theme for the topic for the junior category "Education fosters democracy" and for the senior category "Social media has led to a failure in communication.". In both the categories our girls bagged the second prize.

SJC Bankipore conducted the CISCE zonal level Table- Tennis and Kho - Kho tournament and five of our students were the winners of table tennis and two of them were selected for national level which was held in Kolkota. Twelve of our Kho - Kho players



were selected to play at the regional level at Ranchi. Our Badminton players did well in the zonal and regional levels and were selected for National level at Banglore. A few of our students are selected by SGFI (Sports and Games Federation of India) from which selection to Olympic games could be possible. Suhana Gupta and Gargi, Abilasha and Abishree will be representing Bihar - Jharkhand region in Lawn tennis, Skating and Chess respectively in the national level. Our Karate students secured eight gold medals in the Zonal, four in the regional and two bronze in the national level.

NSB, Shahpur: The Quiz Competition held in Piru in the Diocesan level, NSB, Shahpur students



bagged the 2nd prize. Hockey tournament was held in the District level in Maharaj's College at Ara. NSB girls under 16 years, won the first prize. They now have to play at the state level. One of our girls won 2nd Prize in a speech competition held at the Diocesan Level in Catholic High School, Ara. Within the school too, many competitions were held, such as essay writing, speech, hand writing, recitation, fancy dress, solo song, solo dance etc. Hindi diwas celebrations were organized.

Bathbanga: Mrs. Christine, who runs the Saphara project for the adolescent girls to help them to recognize their worth and help them to stand on their own feet, visited us and she stayed with us. The following day, she had an interactive session with our Saphara students. She was very much impressed by their response. PTM was called for the hostellers' parents to express our concerns regarding the hostellers, for their study, discipline and other matters concerning them.

Dumraon: On 21st Srs. Karuna and Tanushree went for an educational tour with the students of class 9th and 10th to Bodhgaya, the place of enlightenment of Lord Buddha, and the birthplace of Buddhism.

HEALTH MINISTRY

All the members of the health ministry had a two-day meeting and discernment program in Patna. Our resource person was Archbishop Emeritus Rt. Rev. William D'Souza SJ. During the business session we selected members for the Dumraon Health Centre Revival Committee with Srs. Lissy (Chair), Teresita, Shanti and Anita Michael as members. They were entrusted with the responsibility to



study the situation, draw up a plan for the revival and submit the report to the Provincial for consideration and implementation.

Being invited by Sr. Sneha from Chirag, Sr. Lilly went to Chirag to give health education to the girls who are being trained by them. Sr. Prabha was invited by St Mary's School, Buxar to give a talk to the students concerning health.

On 14th Sr. Prabha went to Mokama to attend a meeting conducted for doctors and Sr. Teresita attended one such meeting in Bangalore in the last week of September.

PASTORAL MINISTRY



St. Monica's feast was celebrated in all the parishes as she is the patron saint of 'Mahila Sangh', an organization of mothers in the parishes. In most parishes where our sisters are, they took active part in preparing the women spiritually and organizing the celebration in appreciation of the mothers.

Other pastoral events reported for this edition of the Patna Glimpses is the feast of St. Ann

and Joakkim celebrated in Bankipore and Shahpur as the grant parents' day; they were specially prayed for and honoured after the Holy Mass. The feast of St. Mary Vianney, the patron of parish priests, was celebrated in all the parishes. Logos Bible quiz enthused many of our sisters; the sisters participated themselves and also encouraged the children, youth and the seniors alike to participate in the same; our Sr. Poonam from Shahpur, and Srs. Justina and Vijaya from Bankipore secured prizes. Sr. Selina and others prepared the Cruz Vir (Soldiers of Christ) children for the celebration of the feast of the Holy Cross in the parish at Shahpur on 15th September; during the Mass the children renewed their promise to remain faithful to Christ throughout their lives.

Lepchbusty (Singla) celebrated the Feast day of their Patron St. Ignatius of Loyola. Sr. Cecilia took the Students along with the Parishioners from Singla to Lepchbusty for the celebration.

Our sisters from Bongaigaon reports : "In the month of August we had 30 women staying with us



for three days; they were another Christian from denomination having Bible studies in the Pastoral Centre their own resource bv persons. Whenever the Pastoral Centre has program we are asked to keep the women since there isn't sufficient place at the Centre. The Jesus Youth of the

diocese had 3 days of retreat in the Pastoral Centre. There were more than 100 young people who joined for the program. The young girls stayed with us for 3 nights. Sr. Leshina also joined them for the 3 days retreat. Sr. Leshina with her new found knowledge and enthusiasms helps the college students and has prayer service on every Fridays. Sr. Java C.J was part of the animation team."



Chirag: 9 days of Rosary and Novena was held in Chirag for the people of Kritpura in preparation for the birthday of our Blessed Mother. A rosary procession was held from the center of Kritpura village and was concluded in Chirag campus with Mass on 5th September.

SOCIAL ACTION MINISTRY

CHIRAG - In July, a day of legal aid training, with emphasis on POCSO was given to all the staff of Chirag by Sr. Cynthia. She is a resource person for POCSO Act training to various Schools and religious institutions in and around Bihar. Our tailoring students underwent a training on health and hygiene under the able guidance of Sr. Lilly. On 3rd of August, we had organised an Interactive Session with MP (Member of Parliament) representing Buxar, Mr. Sudhakar Singh and his team.

Chirag Staff and Youth actively participated in this event having studied the needs of the people in our villages and drafted three memorandum that highlighted the poor infrastructure condition, the dysfunctional Primary Health Centre and the poor implementation of 'Jal Nal Yojana' (government program to provide drinking water); soon we could see the rectifications in the infrastructure!



Sr. Bindu, our Provincial's interaction with the youth in the centre and her visit to the supplementary education centres in the villages gave a boost to all involved.

Sr. Rajni from Holy Cross congregation who is the person responsible for monitoring and evaluating the project supported by Swiss League of Catholic Women visited our villages and was inspired by the progress our women have made through the livelihood programme.



On 7th and 8th of September Chirag Team organised girl child day in Tiyara and Chausa Block. Children in good number participated in the rally that sensitised the community on Gender Equality and Gender Justice. The concluding program was held in the common ground of the village where hundreds of people from the village gathered; the Chairman of Chausa was the

chief guest and many other social activists of the place took active part in it. In September two days of training was held for our staff on 'Community Led Development and Leadership' by a team from Sewa Kendra, Patna. They awoke the social responsibility of the staff towards their society and helped them understand the participatory approach to bring changes in the community.

In the second week of July, **Bongaigaon** conducted a training Program for the Government teachers called 'Teaching, Learning Materials'. There were 30 participants and 3 Resource persons. The teachers are better equipped for the service.

A new Supplementary education centre along with the existing ones, was opened in Ossai Ganj, **Shahpur** for the government school going children from the Mahadalit community, with a teacher who is also from the same community that is extremely backward on parameters such as, poverty, social status, education and employment. Professional Training: Sr. Modesta Foundation has extended a new programme to support professional training for students who cannot afford the expenses for the training. Under this programme this year we have three girls and 3 boys for General Nursing and one for B.Ed. Course. Sr.Kiran gave a refresher course to the teachers and supervisors of the Social Work Center from 11 - 13th July. This equipped them with new techniques to improve their teaching skills.

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Children's Parliament: This is something very new to us. Shahpur Social Service Center, joined the




"Provisional Neighbourcracy Parliament of India" (PNP -I) _ an organization involved with Neighbourcracy movement adopting Sociocracy methods in discussions. We launched this programme -Children's Parliament - on 15th August this year. About 30 students of various age groups (8 - 15 years), mainly from government schools came together, along with the sisters and the supervisors to discuss their problems. They spend an hour discussing the social

problems which they face in their village. This exercise is aimed at inclusion of children's recommendations in the upcoming UN document called, "Declaration on future Generation". After having conducted a few such sessions we had send some recommendations from these children to the UN under the name of 'Nirmala Shiksha Bhawan, Bihar'. We were happy to see the name of 'Nirmala Shiksha Bhawan, Bihar' among the short listed Institutions that sent the recommendations.

This is a platform where our children get a chance to voice their genuine concerns in the right place, where they might be heard. This is a success story of our SSC Shahpur. Could this programme be taken up by any of our schools and other SSCs?

The keynote sessions were conducted by Sr Ancy on JPIC and Sr. Cynthia, on UN and SDG goals. The JPIC Province Coordinator, Sr Jyotirmayee enlightened the Meet on the aims and values of JPIC.

Assistant Province Teacher Coordinator Mrs.Nandita Verma motivated children to be the change. School coordinator of SJC Bankipore Mrs.Soma Chatterjee provided an insightful perspective on the ecological dimensions of JPIC. Province Teacher Coordinator Mrs Archana Sharma sensitized the attendees, urging them to integrate JPIC into their lives emphasizing the importance of sustained efforts and commitments.

We visited Gurudwara (the holy place of Sikh religion) and had the dinner out in Marine drive which was enjoyed by all. The core group of Coordinators, teachers, and Sisters convened a meeting to decide on the action plan and provide a feedback on the two days event. Mrs.Nandita Verma took over as the new Province Teacher Coordinator, while Mrs Mili Das was elected as the Assistant Province Teacher Coordinator. With the support from all the Principals and Coordinators and Sr. Nilima the meet was a resounding success. We gratefully acknowledge the contributions of everyone, especially our schools in Patna for the financial support and all the arrangements for the gathering.

Commemorating the World Ozone Day the JPIC council of SJC, Bankipore organized an Environmental quiz for classes 9 to 11. The quiz not only instilled enthusiasm within the students but also helped us to create awareness about certain social

and climatic issues which are often sidelined.


